Obedience Training

Obedience training is the process of teaching a dog and a client command work. An example would be, the handler says sit and the dog sits. Obedience education is the process of teaching the handler the basics:

Sit Sit/Stay Down Down/Stay Stand Heel Loose Leash Walking Release Come Cue/Recall We will also discuss real life challenges such as Living room - Having guest over. Kitchen -Dinner Prep and meal time Vet Visits Grooming

Scheduling Combined programs

Behavior Modification, Basic Obedience & Problem Solving Program– Meet once a week for one hour over a period of 12 to 18 weeks.

Basic manners Program- Client may need to start **Basic Manners Program** after completing **Behavior Modification Program.**

Trainer and client may meet twice a week to complete combined training programs within 12 Weeks as long as the dog is not showing signs of stress and is compliant with training.

Quite often dog's are not compliant to obedience training until the owner has established consistent leadership skills covered in the Behavior Modification Program. Dogs can easily become stressed when the dog is not clear who is leader of their pack. This is where issues over dominance arise. If a dog is stressed it will more then likely not be willing to obey. It is critical we allow the dog enough time to understand the new rules and boundaries set by the pack leader (the dogs owner) and give the dog a chance to calm down. When a dog understands the owner is pack leader this will eliminate a great deal of the dogs dominant attitude.

Client & dog may need to complete **Behavior Modification Program** before starting basic obedience training.

When starting the Problem Solving Program we set aside a minimum 30 minutes to discuss training techniques (\$25.00 per half hour exceeding first hour of training.
